What specifically comes to mind and saddens me is the number of families that live in hotels. Although this is a temporary solution for parents to have a roof over their children's heads it limits, or most often prevents, parents from saving money for permanent housing. However, after more reflection, I realize that despite the challenged times for many families, we had seven families to graduate from Family Promise last year. While that may not seem like a large number, it is seven families that have a stronger foundation, a stronger family, financial stability, and have become productive citizens in our community. I am constantly reminded by the dedicated families that come into our program that homeless is not a condition, it is a temporary situation.

So now what? Where are we headed and what do we do? Much of what "we do" will be similar to what we have been doing. 1. Continue Creating Quality Care—our host congregations will continue to provide meals and shelter for a week at a time, allowing our guests to focus on the future in dignity and with love and compassion. Our volunteers are fully trained to offer just the right level of assistance; their support is crucial to the effectiveness of the program.

2. Creating Capabilities With Our Guests—while in the program our guests receive guidance and counseling on budgeting, job skills, parenting skills, resume writing, filling-out job applications and interview skills—all with the goal of helping them get back on their feet.

Would you like to make a huge difference in the life of a Family Promise guest? If so, then the **Family Promise Mentoring Program** is the place for you. Low-income families face enormous stresses. The Family Promise Mentoring Program is designed to help families overcome these stresses as they work toward becoming a self-sustainable family once again.

In the Family Promise Mentoring Program, economically vulnerable families are matched with trained volunteer mentors who work with them, one-on-one, over an extended period of time for approximately one hour each week.

Mentors help individual families define and meet goals to:

- Develop life skills
- Connect with community resources
- Improve their housing and employment situations
- Nurture and support their children

Mentors build committed, trusting relationships. They listen. They offer understanding and respect. They help families overcome challenges and disappointments and celebrate successes.

Our Director even monitors their ability to save money and utilizes various resources to help them transition back to self-sustainable status. These programs are administered at the Family Promise Day Center and may include experts from professional organizations willing to assist.

3. Transitioning to Self-Sustaintment—our goal is to help families re-establish themselves to a self-sustainable living situation and continue to provide “after program care.” Our extensive network of support agencies and volunteers throughout Houston County enables our guests to use a wide variety of resources to become thriving members of our community.

4. Fully Funded for the Future—we aim to provide streams of income for the Family Promise program that will enable the program to continue. Our goal is to establish and maintain a network of funding streams that remains confident in our ability to provide a needed service to the community at an incredible value.

I know we have a tremendous network of loving, generous volunteers in our community and I appreciate your continued support as we move forward to magnify our results. Together we can propel this important and worthwhile mission to the next level. I look forward to working and serving with you. Thank-you in advance, for your continued support.
