Director's Corner

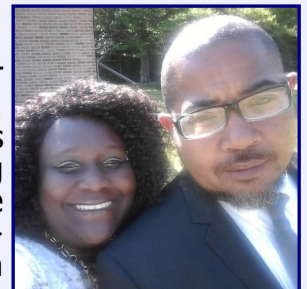

One of the most beautiful things about our work at Family Promise is staying in touch with families after they graduate.

The Peek family graduated from Family Promise in 2016.

They have since become volunteers and are present at most of our public events. I don't think a month goes by that we don't connect with them. I have a special place in my heart for this family because of their dedication to raising their children.

Both dad and mom have had health issues and four surgeries between the two of them over the past year. Dad works part-time and Mom is in school full-time as a Psychology major. They have four children ranging in age from 16 to 7 (3 sons and 1 daughter). Over the past two years I have seen the family without transportation for a few months but they never missed an event for the children. They walked if needed.

The oldest son is in ROTC, Youth Department President at church and works part-time. The second oldest, in high school as well, is on the wrestling and track teams, and is a Junior Usher at church. The youngest son plays football, basketball and baseball, and is also a Junior Usher. The baby of the bunch is an A/B honor roll student and a member of the Junior Choir at church. One of the children was sickly during the previous school year and had to be home schooled in addition to having numerous appointments at Emory in Atlanta. We are thankful to report there have not been any health issues this year.

It is beautiful when families stay connected with Family Promise, not because they have to but because they consider us family. Although being in Family Promise a few years back was an extremely difficult time for the family, they contribute their 90 day stay to being a huge shift in the family. Most importantly they credit God for their ability to maintain mentally, physically, and financially stable since participating in our program.

To all our VOLUNTEERS, never underestimate the difference you make in our families lives. An encounter for a couple of hours can be life-changing. Last year the Peeks volunteered to prepare a meal for our guest families during one of the host weeks. I had no idea they were having car trouble. When they delivered the food I asked, "Why would you drive your car here in this condition?" They simply replied, "Because someone did it for us!"

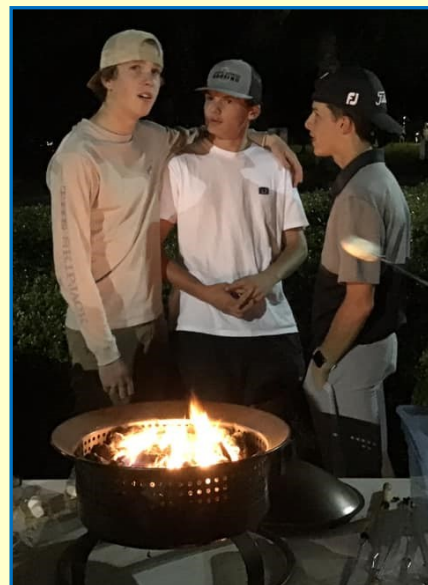
